Founded in 1841, Queen's is one of the top-ranked universities in both in Canada and around the world. Our students, our faculty, our staff and our campus all contribute to the Queen's experience.

Our student body

- Undergraduate students: 13,445

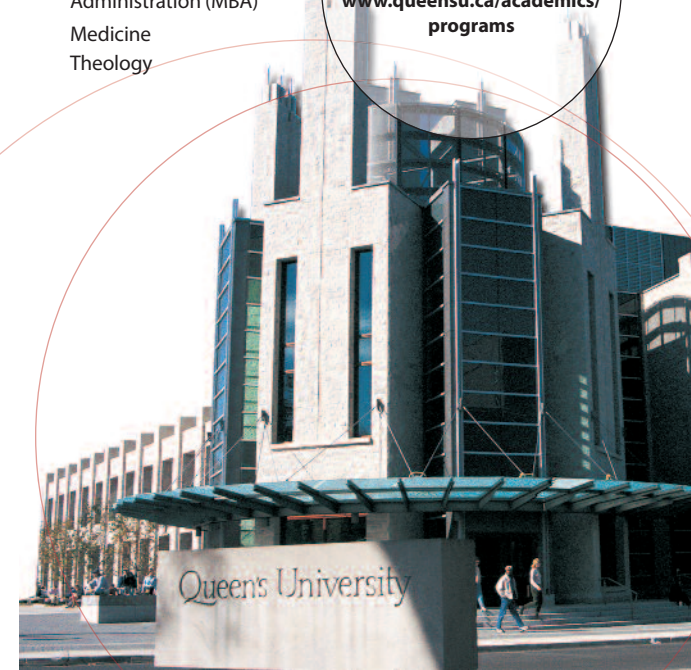

1. December 1 – Application deadline for Major Entrance Awards.
2. Applications are online at www.ouac.on.ca
Apply by February 1 (students attending schools in Canada or the United States) or February 15 (students attending schools outside of Canada or the United States).
3. Check the Applicant Student Query (ASQ) at www.asq.queensu.ca to check the status of your application and for a list of all documents required to complete your application.
4. Submit your Personal statement of Experience (PSE) no later than March 1.
5. Students attending an Ontario high school must submit supporting documentation by March 1.
6. All students not attending an Ontario high school must submit supporting documentation by April 30.

Students are encouraged to complete their application by March 1 to be considered for early offers of admission.

Queen's School of English

A variety of non-degree full-time study options for international students are available through Queen's School of English.

- 12-week English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program features innovative, integrated skills, content based curriculum.
- High standing in 12-week EAP entitles students to be exempt from tests of English facility (e.g. TOEFL) when applying to Queen's.

English Language Requirements

Applicants who have:

- completed an IB diploma (completion of SL English is not sufficient) or
- completed the GCE Advanced Levels or
- lived in a country where English is the acknowledged primary language or
- attended an education institution full-time where the medium of instruction is English for the most recent three years prior to beginning their university studies

are not required to submit a standardized English languages test score (e.g. TOEFL, IELTS).

All other applicants must:

- achieve a satisfactory score on one of the tests of facility in English. For tests of English requirements, please visit www.queensu.ca/admission
- achieve high standing in the 12-week EAP from Queen's School of English
